

Mount Vernon Cancer Services Review Patient and Public Involvement Opportunities



The NHS in the East of England and in North London is reviewing the Mount Vernon Cancer services.

Many of the buildings are not in a good state of repair, there are limited support facilities on the site, and concerns have been raised in relation to the long-term clinical sustainability of the Cancer Centre, which treats people from across Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire, North West London and Thames Valley.

To decide what the best options might be for the future, we are looking at each cancer pathway and want to hear from patients and carers about what does and does not work well for you, and what your priorities would be.

We also need your input into decisions we need to make about the location of additional radiotherapy services for the North Hertfordshire and South Bedfordshire populations, and the way the whole service is organised.

We want to gather as many views as possible because we need to make the best possible changes.

There are many different ways you can get involved, and we will be adding more ways in the coming weeks. Due to the risks of Covid-19, we are not able to hold face to face workshops so many of our activities will take place online. Over the next few pages, you can find out what online events and focus groups are taking place. What this is:

An online focus group for people who live in, or near, central and northern Hertfordshire, and southern and central Bedfordshire, especially those who have experienced radiotherapy treatment as patients or carers. The focus group will look at what is important in a radiotherapy service, and what we do and do not need to consider in choosing a location for a new radiotherapy service in the area, which would be in addition to radiotherapy services at the new Mount Vernon cancer centre.

Participants will see the modelling work which shows what might happen to patient numbers if a new service was introduced in different places, to help consider how best to improve access to radiotherapy for people in this area. Each focus group will have a limited number of places so we can have a good discussion. There will be five satellite radiotherapy focus groups but you only need to attend one as they will all be the same. They are arranged on different days and at different times, and use either Teams or Zoom so you can choose your preferred video conferencing platform.

What this is:

An online focus group for people living in Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire, North West London and Thames Valley, especially those who are being, or have been treated at Mount Vernon Cancer Centre, or their carers.

An independent clinical review showed that to provide the best cancer care, the main cancer services needed to be located on a hospital site that had other services like intensive care. They cannot remain on the existing Mount Vernon site as this does not have the necessary services. This focus group will be to hear from patients what you think the advantages and disadvantages of different ways of doing this—such as moving the whole service onto a different site (not in central London) and creating a specialist cancer centre that can do some of the things patients currently have to travel into London for, or moving most of the service to a different site (not in central London), but leaving some services where they are, or on a different hospital site, or building a specialist cancer centre on a different site (not in central London), and developing some more local or mobile services across the area that can be run by the specialist centre.

Each focus group will have a limited number of places so we can have a good discussion. There will be five model and estates focus groups but you only need to attend one as they will all be the same. They are arranged on different days and at different times, and use either Teams or Zoom so you can choose your preferred video conferencing platform.

What this is NOT:

A general update on the review, a debate about whether to agree with the clinical experts or not, or a vote on a future site.
